I went to Bayview the other day, and there was a member with blood all over his hands—he accidently turned on his electric aircraft on the bench and ripped a couple of new scars in his hand.

This has been a problem for some time - I recall one pilot had two aircraft on the same transmitter and forgot to unplug one, while flying the other. The one in the pits started to move - someone stopped the second one but that could have been a bad accident. I am sure there are other accidents that I don't know about.

We need some help with this problem. My personal solution is I unplug the battery from the motor/esc immediately I return to the pits. Others may use a fuse that is removed / replaced as needed.

Another solution for some is to assign a switch on the transmitter that shuts the throttle stick off although I don't think I have that on my older Futaba transmitters

If any member has a better solution to this, please let me know and I will publish it here.

NEW BUSINESS

New City Contract

Indications were that A Armstrong and L Cragg might be able to meet with city officials to discuss the contract by the end of January. They are waiting for the city officials to advise of the date of the meeting.

Use of Bayview - Ryerson

On Feb 8th, A Armstrong received an email from Ryerson asking to use Bayview for some experiment aircraft testing. After a consult with MAAC Insurance Agent (Tony), Ryerson would need its own insurance. Ashley responded, explained the concern and declined participation.

Knowing these insurance requirements, BRCM will say "No" in the future if similar requests are made.

Insurance Provisions – Guests

Following the interest received from the work J. Fazzari is doing with students and Boy Scouts, the Board was unsure if MAAC insurance would cover a guest trying to fly under the watchful eye of a pilot.

- A Armstrong investigated with MAAC Insurance Agent (Tony)... MAAC covers guests to fly as long as the pilot has control via a buddy box system.
- A. Armstrong indicated that the Board will look to add the following as Bylaw 25 (iv)... Guests may fly without MAAC membership with a buddy box provided the pilot in control holds a current MAAC membership card and is a member in good standing of the club.

Taxiway Discussion

- As per of the suggestions received for updates/improvements for 2016, a suggestion was put forth to install taxiways at Bayview. J. Fazzari has taken the lead on investigating taxiway options so that the membership is educated on the various possibilities before deciding whether or not this idea should be pursued.
- J. Fazzari presented a PowerPoint to the membership around 5 taxiway alternatives (PowerPoint is on the club Forum). The membership feedback will be posted on the club forum, however below is a summary of the general discussion points:
 - Discussion amongst members on whether or not taxiways would be harmful to landing gear if using grass runway.

If taxiway is not wide enough, members will not use.

Some planes can't be taxied.

- Taxiways are in place at other fields with good success. Some feedback received so far but more research required if this were to proceed.
- Bayview used to have a diagonal runway (one of the options presented). Was not used and approach was difficult. Was removed.
- Lots of discussion on improving the grass condition (various options discussed). Some concerns that there would be little improvement due to clay soil, no water and methane gas in ground.
- A suggestion was put forth to do a trial of a taxiway at one end only. Remove or modify as required based on trial feedback
- It was also raised that when the paved runway was extended, taxiways were part of the scope of work and the membership voted against... Update following the meeting: T. Brum could not find anything in the past minutes to support this statement.
