HARRY BARNARD—MASTER BUILDER AND PILOT

Harry Barnard was a good man! He was a friend to many in our Burlington R/C Club and many of us benefited from his vast knowledge of engines, electronics, building and flying techniques.

Harry was a good man for our club. He was a founding member, a past president, secretary and for many years a director. He represented our club when he won the Canadian Scale Championship Trophy with his J-3 Cub and has won many other smaller scale awards. For many years he was our Chief Pilot and flight-tested many of our creations. He was always available as an instructor for new and existing members. I asked Harry recently how many people he had instructed—he said that he didn't know but it must be between 30 and 40 people.

Harry was a good man for MAAC. He was a member of the Giant Scale Committee and judged at many events across Canada for scale and pattern contests. He was invited to judge for the World Championships in France and said he loved the food and the wine even though he couldn't drink that much.

In my 35 years of being a friend, our conversations always drifted to cars—new and old, aircraft—full scale (not jets) and models (not jets) and his family. He was very proud of his four children and adored his wife, Angela.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF MAY 2016

Now that the flying season has really started it is imperative that all pilots be aware that safety and courtesy to others is everybody's responsibility.

SAFETY

Some of the things to remember.

According to Burlington Hydro, the un-insulated power line at the east end of the field carries 2,400 volts AC ,so if perchance your aircraft becomes hung up on this line DO NOT TRY TO RETRIEVE IT BUT CALL BURLINGTON HYDRO, YOU COULD BE VERY BADLY HURT / KILLED , PLEASE ADVISE ANY GUEST FLYERS.

From reports in the newspaper and on the Wireless, Lyme Disease is becoming more prevalent in southern Ontario. This is spread by small ticks which like to live in long grass. Bayview and Bronte have large areas of long grass around the fields, if you have to retrieve your plane from these areas you should preferably be wearing long trousers tucked into your socks. Boots are very much better than open toed sandals, when you exit from the long grass you should check that no ticks are sticking on your clothes. Check the Internet for a full description of this disease. Not nice

One of our rules / guidelines is not to fly alone. If you have a serious injury you may have to be driven to the Hospital, in addition it don't go hunting for your plane in the woods or Death valley ALONE just in case you have an accident, always let somebody know where you are going.

Let other pilots, who are flying, know your intentions with respect to TAKING OFF LANDING OR GOING ONTO THE FIELD so they can stay up <u>high</u> out of danger.

If you are flying more than one Electric aircraft please be sure that the one that is not flying has been switched off prior to taking the other up.

My belief is that this club must try to try accommodate all member's needs with respect to the types and sizes of aircraft that they fly. It is unfortunate that Bayview has been built backwards, i.e. The active grass runway is between the flight line and the asphalt runway, there has been much discussion on installing Geotech Taxiways so order that small wheeled aircraft have the ability to taxi out to the Asphalt runway. There are strong arguments for and against them. So the board has decided on 2 lines of attack. The first is that we have rolled the field and in addition we have embarked on a regimen of Weed, Feed, and Seeding to improve the quality of the grass. However water is always a problem Doug Edwards is looking into a solution for this.

The 2 nd line of attack is to present to the club members at the next GM (May 26 th) a COMPROMISE layout for a Geotech runway starting at the west end of the flight line going out to the west end of the runway. Hopefully a solution will be reached.

Doug Edwards has received Quotations on completely installing new chain link fencing at Bayview, as what we have right now looks pretty ratty. This will be presented at the next GM for your vote and approval.

Wade Weppler and Myself attended a meeting at the Rifle Club this past week and it would appear that we would be able to tie into their Internet system so that we can either have our own weather system or use their's Wade is looking after this, Our discussions with the Rifle Club will continue as we might have mutual interests.

On a lighter note it was brought to my attention via an e-mail that was forwarded to me that my report of last month was completely missing lower case letters. The club member asked whether my computer had run out of said letters. I had not noticed this so had Microsoft e-mail a whole bunch to me as you will notice in this report.
